Dear Residents of YHC Properties,

Window Replacement at New Parkridge

New Parkridge maintenance staff has been working hard to ensure timely replacement of damaged windows onsite, but we realize the process has not been timely enough. Unfortunately, we used all of the windows we had in stock and our supplier needs 7-10 days to manufacture and install the windows. We will do better by having a larger stock of replacement windows on hand to ensure they are replaced immediately should other damages occur. We would like to thank residents for their patience while we work to restore the beauty of this community.

Parking at New Parkridge

In an effort to discourage loitering on the property, new parking policies have been rolled out at New Parkridge (see pg. 3). Any guests of residents will need to visit the property management office to obtain a visitor's pass that will be good for 24 hours. Any resident who does not have his or her permanent resident pass should not park on the site and should visit the office immediately to obtain one. Any vehicles that do not have the necessary passes will be considered unauthorized and towed off the premises immediately.

We would like to send a special thank you to all of the residents who signed the petition and showed up at City Council meetings because speed bumps and stop signs have been installed along Armstrong Dr. This is an important measure that helps to keep the residents of this community safe. Thank you.

In efforts to address the recent violence, New Parkridge is implementing a new parking system

EFFECTIVE JULY 4TH 2019

Residents

Residents who have a valid car in their name must have your permanent parking sticker visibly in the bottom left corner on your car window. If you do not yet have your sticker, you can obtain one by bringing your title to the leasing office.

All cars on the premises without a valid parking pass will be towed at the owners expense.

Motorcycles are considered vehicles and must be parked in a valid parking spot otherwise it will be considered illegally parked and will be towed at the owners expense.

Vehicles which are considered abandoned (such as flat tires, hoods lifted up, parts falling off, busted windows, expired tags, no plates, etc.) will be towed at the owners expense regardless of a valid parking pass.

Guests

The current green guest parking passes will be no longer be accepted beginning 7/4/19.

To obtain a guest parking pass the GUEST must come into the office and provide a valid drivers license and license plate number to obtain a guest pass.

ALL GUEST PASSES WILL ONLY BE VALID FOR 24 HOURS!!

All cars on the premises without a valid guest parking pass will be towed at the owners expense.

Any violation of these guidelines will result in the towing of the vehicle at the owners expense by Budget Towing who can be contacted at (734) 485-2055 to get your vehicle back.


