REMINDERS

- No Charcoal grills allowed. Gas grills are allowed
- Residents with authorized service animals need to pick up after them.
- Residents who receive City trash pickup CANNOT put bins out before <u>4pm on Thursday</u> and MUST have bins off the street by <u>5pm on Friday</u>
- Please make sure to check mailboxes regularly, for inspection notices, recertification notices, etc.
- Please come into the office in a timely manner if you are scheduled for recertification. If you cannot
 make your appt. please contact a property management office.
- If you receive a pest control notice, you must have your unit ready for treatment and/or inspection on the date stated. Failure to do so will result in a fee added to your account.
- Late fee reminders: Rent is due on the 1st, on the 5th it is considered late. On the 6th a \$5 fee will be added to your account, and \$1 fee will be added for each additional day late up to \$25.
- PLEASE USE THE RENT DROPBOX. If you are in need of a receipt, call after dropping it in the box. Attempting to wait for a property manager to personally take your check after the dates listed above, may result in late fees.



Required Documentation for 2017 Christmas Assistance

- Current I.D. for <u>all adults</u> in the household (Michigan Driver's License, Michigan State I.D or current passport.) The last four digits of Social Security numbers are required for all household members.
- Proof of residence (Official Rental Agreement, Mortgage Statement)
- Proof of dependents in the home (Social Security cards <u>AND</u> one of the following required; birth certificates, school records, guardianship papers, insurance cards, updated shot records or mail with child's name on it)
- Proof of current household income (at or below 200% poverty level-see chart below)
